Essay Questions (answer one)

3. What impact should social trends have on Judaism?

Information & Criteria for Submissions

- ✓ Monograph length 1500-2000 words.
- ✓ Primary and secondary sources mandatory with weight given to primary research including personal testimonies and interviews.
- ✓ Undergraduate students must hold a B average. University transcript required.
- ✓ Bibliography / Works Cited must follow MLA standard.
- ✓ Submissions due April 30, 2009.

Exclusive Student Awards

Winning submissions reflecting exceptional research and presentation will be rewarded with educational prizes including a **full-year tuition scholarship to the Rothberg International School of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem** (valued at \$12,000 USD, valid for 3 years) and a **summer Israel experience or roundtrip airfare to Israel**. More prizes to be added. Prizes are non transferable and hold no cash value.

Supporting a Struggling Jewish Community and Yaldeinu

Bolivia is the poorest country in South America. Nearly two-thirds of its people live in poverty, including one-third who live in conditions of extreme poverty.

Once a strong and vibrant community of 10,000 people, Bolivia's Jewish community, which lives in the capital city of La Paz, currently has only 200 inhabitants. The community is organized by the Circulo Israelita. Funds raised through **Morrow's Voice** will establish and supplement a Jewish school in La Paz and provide funding for a student Aid Mission to Bolivia in the summer of 2009. Funds will also be used for Yaldeinu's other projects in the region.
